

IHEEM International Travel Bursary – Scheme Details

- Travel Bursary awardees will undertake or take part in a specific and relevant healthcare engineering or facility management project in a developing nation. For the purpose of this award, a developing nation is defined as country with an emerging and developing economy classified by the International Monetary Fund.
- The bursary is open to all Graduate and young members of the Institute. Young is defined as under 36 years of age on the 31st December 2011
- The bursary award is up to £5,000 grant to cover travel and accommodation expenses. Payments will be made on production of receipts, though an advance of monies can be made against proposed future expenditure.
- Two awards are available.
- Candidates are required to produce an outline plan and synopsis of the project. This must be submitted by 31st March 2011
- Candidates should gain outline approval from their employer before submitting their synopsis. Evidence of this approval must be included in the application.
- The candidates employer may supplement the award, but there must be no restriction on the use of the study or research material produced as a result of the project undertaken.
- The bursary award winners will be adjudged and decided by the Membership Committee in April 2010
- The proposed project is to be completed by the 31st December 2011
- A condition of the Award is the submission of a 2,000 to 2,400 word article for the IHEEM Journal within 3 months after return from the travel bursary event. Use of relevant photographs is encouraged.
