Healthcare Engineering is a multi-disciplinary specialty that focuses on advancing healthcare through engineering approaches.

This can involve planning and designing hospitals, maintaining and managing medical equipment, ensuring the fire alarms and escape routes work.



What do I need to be a Healthcare Engineer?

Qualifications & when to start:



GCSE: A minimum of 3 GCSE's including English, Maths and Science, particularly Physics.



A Level: 2 or 3 A levels including Maths and Physics.

T-Level: T-Levels, introduced in September 2020, can be taken in 'building services engineering'.

Apprenticeship: You can complete an Engineering apprenticeship.



University: Foundation degree in an engineering based course, bachelor's degree or masters degree.



Apprenticeship: A higher apprenticeship, (level 4 and 5) or degree apprenticeship (level 6 and 7) will allow you to learn on the job at a university level.
